Title: Warm climate and celestial sceneries

1. Aoshima Island

The small island of Aoshima is home to subtropical plants such as fountain palm trees flourishing and wave-like rock formations known as "Devil's Washboard". Aoshima Shrine, located in the center of the island, is dedicated to those figures in Japanese mythology that are Hikohohodemi-no-mikoto known as Yamasachi-hiko, and his wife Toyotama-hime who is said to be a deity of love and relationships.

2. Takachiho Gorge

Takachiho Gorge consists of cliffs eroded by pyroclastic flows from Mount Aso and is designated as National scenic beauty and National natural monument. At its highest point that is over 100 meters, there is the beautiful Manai Waterfall where river flows in. It has been selected as one of the 100 best waterfalls in Japan. The gorge offers beautiful natural sceneries all throughout the year. From spring to early summer, mountain cherry blossoms, azaleas and wisteria decorate the cliffs, autumn leaves change color in autumn, and ice ornaments here beautifully in winter. At Takachiho Shrine nearby, you can enjoy watching the Night Kagura throughout the year. This performance tells the stories of the deities in Japanese mythology.

3. Sun Messe Nichinan

The iconic seven Moai statues and a park with spectacular ocean view welcome visitors. The statues smiling and standing against the beautiful sea are the only replicas allowed to be made of the originals in the entire world with an official permission from Easter Island. It is said that touching the Moai statues brings you good luck and each statue has different blessings which are (from the most right statue to the most left one): academic achievement, economic fortune, marriage success, overall good luck, good luck in love, good luck in health, and career success.

1. Aoshima Island

Aoshima Shrine, located in the center of the island, is a Shinto shrine dedicated to Japanese mythological figures Hikohohodemi-no-mikoto, also known as Yamasachi-hiko, and his wife, Toyotama-hime, who are said to be deities of love and relationships.

2. Takachiho Gorge

Takachiho Gorge consists of cliffs eroded by pyroclastic flows (dense, fast-moving flows of solidified lava pieces) from Mount Aso and is designated as a National Scenic Beauty and National Natural Monument. At its highest point, which is over 100 meters, sits the beautiful Manai Waterfall, which showcases the overflow of a nearby river. The waterfall is recognized as one of the 100 best waterfalls in Japan. Takachiho Gorge offers beautiful natural scenery throughout the year. From spring to early summer, mountain cherry blossoms, azaleas and wisteria decorate the cliffs. Autumn brings brilliant color changes to the scenic foliage, and winter snows and ice embellish the gorge's natural beauty. At nearby Takachiho Shrine, visitors can watch the Night Kagura, a traditional performance that tells stories about the most famous deities in Japanese mythology. The Night Kagura can be enjoyed any time of the year.

3. Sun Messe Nichinan

Featuring the only replicas of the famous statues on Easter Island, Sun Messe Nichinan welcomes visitors to stroll the serene grounds and enjoy the ocean view. The seaside park functions as an outdoor art museum of sorts and showcases seven smiling Moai statues, plus several other iconic structures. According to legend, touching the Moai statues brings good luck, and each statue offers different blessings, including (from left to right) career success, good health, love, overall good luck, success in marriage, economic fortune and academic achievement.
